IV. The Work of Reconciliation Should be Valued over Making Judgments

"Stop Judging People!"

A. Reconciliation is best accomplished when the church stops making Judgments

- 1. The chief sin is not the actual sin, but the actual judgment of that particular sin
- 2. Cannot tell anybody they may be wrong or in sin, unless one disagrees with their ideology
- 3. Progressives are (ironically) so very judgmental when it comes to certain issues (i.e. masks, vax, sexual ethics, environmental issues, racism, etc. . . .)

B. <u>Biblical Perspective</u>

- 1. Everybody judges, it all depends on the authority, the standard
- 2. Discerning between Judgmentalism and Righteous Judgment
- 3. People can only be reconciled when judgments are made (wrong made right)
- 4. Church must be gracious and charitable, but it does not mean that we fail or refuse to call out behavior that is wrong or sinful
 - a) John 7:24
 - b) Matthew 7:1ff
 - c) Zechariah 8:16

V. Gracious Behavior is More Important than Right Belief

A. The Downplaying of Sound Doctrine

- 1. What truly matters is not so much what we believe but especially how we behave
- 2. Willingness to compromise the truth of God's word in order to demonstrate "love" and "compassion"
- 3. Will "pick and choose" then proceed to misuse Bible passages Biblical principles
 - a) i.e. Student loan forgiveness is right because Jesus forgives our debts!!

B. <u>Biblical Perspective</u>

- 1. Truly gracious behavior finds its source in Sound Doctrine
 - a) Ephesians/Colossians
 - b) Titus 2:1; 2:7-10
 - c) 2 Timothy 4:2-4
- 2. Good theology consistently applied shows itself in gracious behavior because it honors/obeys God's objective truth and unchanging standard
- 3. We must always be gracious, kind, caring and compassionate, but at the same time never compromise the truth for the sake of "love" or "loving thy neighbor"
- 4. Is it more gracious to affirm people in a lie or to tell them the truth?

VI. Inviting Questions is More Valuable than Supplying Answers

The idea that their can be no real certainty

A. Nobility in not knowing

- 1. Being "open" and "unsure" shows "humility"
- 2. Progressives want to say that we cannot be certain about most things . . . i.e. Reliability of Scripture Sufficiency Doctrines . . . (Hell Women's Roles Gay Christianity)
- 3. Uncertainty allows you to deny the truth while "trying" to find the truth
- 4. Position Conservatives as "Sure" Dogmatic Rigid Closed Minded Arrogant

B. <u>Biblical Perspective</u>

- 1. We are to openly invite all honest, sincere questions and take them seriously
- 2. We are not equally certain about all things regarding the faith, but we are certain that the Scriptures contain the answer, even if we do not fully understand
- 3. The basis for certainty is the word of God 2 Timothy 3:15-16; 2 Peter 1:20
- 4. It's a matter of Believing the truth that is contained in Scripture

VII. Encouraging the Personal Search is More Important Than Group Unity

- Focuses on the Individual
- Undermines Unity in the Church

A. Progressives:

- See people as "brave" when they question/deviate from Orthodoxy, while seeing those who hold firmly to biblical teachings as those who simply "go along" with leadership
- 2. Church is trying to protect its own authority/power
- 3. Church is narrow-minded and not concerned with the hurting/questioning individual
- 4. View church Discipline as archaic unloving and unnecessary
- 5. Not content with God's truth or convinced His ways are best

B. <u>Biblical Perspective</u>:

- 1. We are the Body of Christ and as such we ought to be in a great deal of agreement as regenerated believers in Christ
 - a) 1 Corinthians 1:10
 - b) Ephesians 4:1-6
 - c) Philippians 2:1-2
- 2. It's not about finding your own path, following your feelings, but conforming to God's word, seeking His truth
 - a) Romans 12:1-5
 - b) 1 John 2:15-17
- 3. It's not about man's journey to find God, but God "finding" us
 - a) 1 John 4:10
 - b) Romans 5:8
