## VIII. Meeting Actual Needs is More Important than Maintaining Institutions

Closely related to previous lesson

### A. A lessening of the importance of the Church

- 1. Outdated
- 2. Concentrated Power/Control
- 3. Corruption of all kinds (Focus on sexual sins)
- 4. A false dichotomy between the Church and her mission
  - a) Help solve the very real needs in the society
  - b) Work for the cause of justice equity inclusion
  - c) So spiritually minded, do no earthly good

# B. Biblical Perspective

- 1. Main Mission of the Church is to preach the gospel and make disciples
  - a) Matthew 28:18f
  - b) Acts 1:8
- 2. Works of Mercy flow from the gospel
  - a) Ephesians 2:10
  - b) James 2
- 3. The Church is not simply a social entity but a called out people who proclaim the Good News of the Gospel and provide Salt and Light to a dying world

## IX. Peacemaking is More Important Than Power

Attacking the Authority of the Church

#### A. Progressive

- 1. Peacemaking basically means capitulating to, or compromising with the culture
- 2. To be at peace is either tossed or full on acceptance affirmation embracing . . .
- 3. Power is based in the structure of authority in the Church (which leads to abuse)

# B. Authority vs. Authoritarianism

- 1. Biblical authority is God-given Legitimate authority upholds God's standard, rejects error, teaches sound doctrine, etc.
- 2. Authoritarianism Not interested in impartiality, maintaining or pursuing peace
- 3. It is marked by harsh shepherding, unquestioned authority, unbiblical discipline, etc.

### C. Biblical Perspective

- Peacemaking begins with the Gospel Making peace between sinful man and holy God
  - a) Colossians 1:19-20
  - b) Romans 5:10-11
  - c) Ephesians 2:14-16
- 2. Seek to live in Peace with others
  - a) Romans 12:18
  - b) Matthew 5:9
- 3. God given biblical authority is legitimate and ought not be abused, but bad leadership is not a reason to reject all leadership
