- A. The Church cannot authenticate Books that it does not have
- B. He Providentially assures that the Books are not lost or forgotten

- B. Three Major Qualities (next week)

III. Role of the Holy Spirit

- A. The Internal Testimony of the Holy Spirit He needed to reveal the Divine qualities
- B. He enables us to see what is already there (i.e. Conversion)
- C. The Spirit overcomes the effects of Sin
- D. Book is Canonical because of the objective divine qualities it contains

IV. <u>Corporate Reception</u> - (Church)

- A. Divine qualities are apprehended by the Community of Believers
- B. The Covenant Community collectively received the Books
- C. The Books received, used, copied, distributed in the early church

V. <u>Apostolic Origin</u>

- A. God delivered His message in a distinct block of time through a distinct office (Apostolic)
- B. Not Random or Arbitrary
- C. Apostolic office has ceased
- D. Ephesians 2:20 Foundational

E. Chosen by Christ

- 1. 12 + Paul
- 2. Had to be part of Jesus' ministry
- 3. Had to have seen the Risen Christ
- F. Carry Jesus' Authority
- G. Writings are authoritative
- H. Written directly by Apostles or recorded by close associates (Mark Luke; Peter Paul)
- I. The early Church collected the writings and used them
- J. Early Church Fathers tried to claim their writings were Scripture
